REDUCING IMPACTS

Improving traffic flow and transit reliability on 108th Avenue Northeast will require King County Metro to acquire small portions of some properties.

Most of the space—two-thirds of it—is currently devoted to non-residential uses, such as Northwest University, the Kirkland Seventh-Day Adventist Church and the Shell station.

The traffic flow project will require, at most, small portions of a dozen residential properties, including the Village Condominiums.
