## Paving NE 132nd Street begins

Kirkland's contractor will start the overlay project with curb ramp repairs

**WHAT:** A City of Kirkland contractor is planning this summer to repave NE 132nd Street between 100th Avenue NE and 112th Avenue NE.

Lakeside Industries will begin the work by rebuilding sidewalk curb ramps and repairing any sections of damaged concrete curb that exist along that stretch of roadway.

The curb ramp upgrades will improve access for travelers of all abilities and ensure the City of Kirkland is in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

This is the final City of Kirkland Capital Improvement Project expected for this section of NE 132nd Street. Previous projects on NE 132nd Street include adding right-turn lanes to 108th Avenue NE and at Raven Way to Juanita High School, and WSDOT's project to open a half-diamond interchange for I-405 which also replaced two signals with two, two-lane roundabouts. These projects increased pedestrian visibility, made crossings safer, increased queue lengths for right-turn lanes, and provided environmental improvements to Juanita Creek.

**WHEN:** Lakesides' crews are working from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The project is expected to begin construction on Monday, August 5.

**WHAT TO EXPECT:** Lakeside Industries will maintain access for emergency responders, mail, deliveries, waste management, and local residents.

- Drivers should expect minor traffic delays, lane-shifts and some lane-closures.

- Some sections of sidewalk will be unavailable while Lakesides' crews rebuild them.

- The Construction crew will notify residents at least 24 hours before the contractor begins the repaving process by going door to door.

# Raised crosswalk to be installed on Holmes Point Drive at O.O. Denny Park

The City of Kirkland is planning to slow traffic speeds along Holmes Point Drive by installing a raised crosswalk this summer at O.O. Denny Park.

This will compliment the speed cushions installed on Holmes Point Drive last fall.

Kirkland is installing the raised crosswalk by utilizing the Street Preservation Program Overlay Contractor who are repaving NE 132nd Street, NE 139th Street and NE 140th Street. Traffic calming measures, such as speed cushions, become candidates for capital projects after City staff collects data on traffic speeds and volumes.

Several sets of traffic analysis have revealed excessive speeding along Holmes Point Drive at O.O. Denny Park. This project was also highly desired by the neighborhood and was included in the Holmes Point Street Standard Corridor Study approved by City Council in 2022.

## Finn Hill neighborhood streets among dozens to be slurry sealed in August

Kirkland's maintenance crews save taxpayer dollars every year by using the annual street paving process to maintain and repair stormwater drainage systems that are beneath the road's surface.

Sometimes, these crews will install curb, gutters and catch basins—also known as storm drains—during this process. These structures reduce flooding potential by promoting the flow of runoff. Residents can help reduce flooding potential in their
