## **RESOLUTION R-5631**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DECLARING THE CITY'S COMMITMENT TO **ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS** THROUGH Α PERSON-CENTERED APPROACH AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO DEVELOP A HOMELESSNESS CONTINUUM OF CARE ACTION PLAN FOR NEW POLICIES, PROGRAMS, AND SERVICES THAT PREVENT AND RESPOND TO UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS IN KIRKLAND.

WHEREAS, the City Council's Goals include both 'Attainable Housing', to provide access to housing and encourage the construction and preservation of housing stock that meet a diverse range of incomes and needs, and 'Supportive Human Services,' to meet basic human needs, help people through economic and personal crises, help individuals thrive, and strive to remove barriers to allow all equal opportunities to succeed; and

WHEREAS, ensuring access to safe and stable places to live is foundational for creating a community where everyone belongs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires that the experience of homelessness be rare, brief, and non-recurring in the city and has made significant investments over time in local and regional housing and homelessness projects and programs to accomplish this goal; and

WHEREAS, in 2023, the City Manager convened an interdepartmental team, titled the Coordinated Response to Homelessness Team, consisting of leadership across numerous City departments to ensure interdepartmental coordination, streamline processes, and maximize resources across the homelessness response system; and

WHEREAS, the City is in the midst of a major update of its Comprehensive Plan, including both the Housing and Human Services Elements, with a focus on creating new and enhanced policies to foster the creation of more affordable housing units in Kirkland and to support the City's response to homelessness; and

WHEREAS, the Coordinated Response to Homelessness Team prioritizes a person-centered and compassionate approach when considering situations involving unhoused community members while also ensuring the safety of unhoused persons, housed neighbors, businesses, visitors, and responding staff; and

WHEREAS, the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit has made several rulings cautioning cities against taking actions to criminalize homelessness, including enforcement of overnight camping bans on public spaces unless nearby shelter is available, and

the Supreme Court of the United States is reviewing these decisions in 2024; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland's Homeless Outreach Coordinator engaged 124 households representing 160 individuals experiencing homelessness in 2023, the most recent Point-in-Time Count showed a 23% increase in homelessness in King County from 2022 to 2024, and there is growing concern that the rising cost of housing will continue to exacerbate the rate at which individuals enter homelessness for the first time; and

WHEREAS, other jurisdictions in King County have seen rapid increases of unhoused residents camping in public spaces and have urged all cities to proactively prepare to respond to such increases; and

WHEREAS, the City Council remains committed to ensuring public spaces in Kirkland are safe, accessible, and enjoyed by all; and

WHEREAS, the City Council affirms that the City of Kirkland is not a regional homelessness service provider such as King County government, the King County Regional Homelessness Authority, and regional non-profit organizations, and that the actions identified through this resolution are intended to support those experiencing homelessness in Kirkland and connect them to regional services; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes it needs to make concurrent investments in programs, policies, and services along the housing and homelessness continuum of care to keep Kirkland a belonging community enjoyed by all and a place where community members experiencing housing instability have access to resources needed to thrive, with the goal that homelessness is rare, brief, and non-recurring.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to create a Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan to be presented for Council consideration by December 31, 2024.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan shall provide objectives and actions to support, at minimum, the following identified policy goal areas:

- a. Prevent homelessness where possible through continued investment in prevention programs and support of legislation that creates and retains additional affordable housing units.
- b. When homelessness occurs, support unhoused individuals in their transition back to stable housing through relationshipbuilding and re-connecting to resources.
- c. Provide a compassionate and dynamic response to situations involving unhoused residents, acting on a case-by-case basis to

best meet the unhoused individual's needs with dignity and respect.

- d. Provide timely Homelessness Assistance Response Team contact with those experiencing homelessness when notified by anyone submitting non-emergency reports of unhoused individuals, provide prompt acknowledgment to those submitting the reports, and explore alternative pathways for the community to activate the Homeless Assistance and Response Team such as a dedicated phone line, phone apps and web-based activation.
- e. Collaborate among City departments and with key community and regional partners at every stage of the continuum of care, leveraging the unique resources provided by faith-based groups, regional service providers, A Regional Coalition for Housing (ARCH), the King County Regional Homelessness Authority, King County's Permanent Supportive Housing programs on the Eastside, and other community partners and avoid duplication of services.
- f. Invest in a spectrum of policy and program options to create choice and accountability for unhoused community members, including policies for enforcement action if shelter space or alternative locations are available and other strategies are not effective.
- g. Investigate and build on learnings and best practices from other communities that have implemented programs, policies, and services along the housing and homelessness continuum of care.
- h. If enforcement action becomes necessary, utilize enforcement policies that will prioritize the safety of staff, the unhoused individual, surrounding housed and unhoused community members, businesses, and prevent negative impacts to public lands, critical areas, and waterways.
- i. Identify both local and regional short, medium, and long-term funding strategies to accomplish each of the goal areas.

Section 3. In developing the Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan, including identifying service needs and designing new programs, the City Manager shall collect feedback from key stakeholders including, but not limited to, residents, faith-based groups, service providers, neighboring jurisdictions, landlords, regional housing and homelessness groups, active and past participants of Kirkland homelessness programs to incorporate voices with lived experience, businesses, the Kirkland Downtown Association, the Kirkland Chamber of Commerce, the Lake Washington School District, and the Lake Washington Institute of Technology. The City Manager shall use any public education and engagement tools necessary to collect this

feedback including convening town halls and public forums related to the Action Plan.

<u>Section 4</u>. To support the development of the Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan, the City Manager is authorized and directed to:

- a. Evaluate and refine homelessness data collection strategies to right-size solutions to meet Kirkland-specific community needs.
- b. Prepare issue papers on homelessness response system gaps and potential responses to a rapid influx of individuals experiencing homelessness identified by the Coordinated Response to Homelessness Team to be included with the 2025-2026 budget transmittal.
- c. Evaluate potential funding sources and prepare service packages for the 2025-2026 budget process at tiered levels of investment for Council consideration.
- d. Compile summaries of other actions the City has taken related to homelessness to include in the Action Plan to support comprehensive tracking, evaluation, and reporting to the Council and the community.
