Subject: CITY COUNCIL REQUEST FOR RANKED RECOMMENDATIONS

RECOMMENDATION

That the Human Services Commission provide a ranked order of their one-time funding recommendations for the City Council.

BACKGROUND DISCUSSION

During the City Council's review of the Human Services Commission recommendations on October 20, 2020, Councilmembers requested that the Commission provide a priority order of the grants requested in the additional funding package. While the Council was supportive of the recommendations, the members recognized that there will be a number of difficult budget decisions and may only be able to partially fund the request. If they are only able to partially fund the \$240,306 annual request, Council would like to know the Commission's highest priorities.
